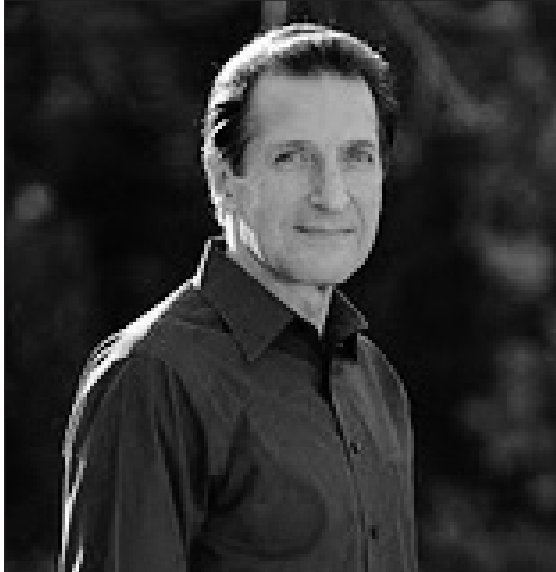

DIRECTIONS TO SEBRING CAMP

From Canton, Ohio: take Rt. 62 approximately 4 miles east of Alliance, turn left at Perkins Family Restaurant.

Pittsburgh area: East on Rt. 60, left on 51 towards Salem, Ohio. At Salem, take Rt. 62 west to Perkins Family Restaurant and turn right.

Cleveland area: Rt. 4 to Deerfield. At Deerfield take 14 towards Salem (2-1/10 mil), turn right on Johnson Rd. Approx. 5 miles to camp.

PRESIDENT’S MESSAGE



Called to be an Extremist: Be Joyful—Always!
Most of us would not claim to be joyful all the time. Yet Paul’s command in Philippians 4:4 is to rejoice—always. He qualifies it by adding that our rejoicing is to be “in the Lord,”

but provides the double emphasis with, “And again I say, rejoice!”

Though the state of continual rejoicing may seem personally unfamiliar, there are those people in our experience who have appeared to be joyful all the time. She was to me, a children’s evangelist, a youth worker, and later, a dear friend and mentor. I can still hear her voice, her words, and the melody with which she would proclaim, “Oh Lord, You’ve been so good to me!”
